

Standard Requirements for Cold Aisle Computer Room Layout

Cold aisle design in data centers requires proper aisle width, length, airflow management, and adherence to ASHRAE thermal guidelines to ensure efficient cooling and equipment reliability.

Cold Aisle Layout and Dimensions

Cold aisles are formed by arranging server racks so that the fronts of the racks face each other, creating a corridor where chilled air is supplied through perforated floor tiles or overhead systems. Standard design recommendations include:

- Aisle Width: Minimum of 1.2 meters to allow two full floor tiles between cabinet fronts, ensuring optimal airflow and personnel access. Wider aisles may be required for ceiling heights above 3.7 meters to accommodate lifts and overhead systems .
- Aisle Length: Maximum of 16 meters for continuous rows. If one end is closed or lacks an exit, limit the length to 6 meters for safe access and evacuation .
- Raised Floor: Often used as a supply air plenum to distribute cold air efficiently to the front of racks .

Airflow Management

Effective cold aisle design separates cold intake air from hot exhaust air to prevent mixing, which improves cooling efficiency and reduces energy consumption:

- Cold air is delivered to the front of IT equipment, which draws it in for cooling.
